

Keeney has contributed to the books Historic West Virginia, the forthcoming West Virginia Encyclopedia, and his research on West Virginia Labor History has been published in The Mountain Messenger. Keeney also worked for ESPN on the 2000 documentary Remembering Marshall: Thirty Years Later. He has contributed poetry to two books - Windows of Perception and The Best Poems of 2000. His first novel, To Live Again, was published in August 2002. His first screenplay, Fools Paradise (Co-authored with H. Shawn Sowards) was completed in the summer of 2002. Joseph Estephan of Screenwriters Associates Inc. is currently representing the script. Today, Chuck Keeney continues his research in West Virginia History and is at work on a second novel, Wasting the Dawn.

Thomas Keeney TN-IN-MO

Thomas married Nancy FUGATE probably in Tennessee. He moved, along with his brothers and sister and possibly his father, to Indiana where he purchased property and was active in the church. He applied for dismissal from the church for himself and his wife Nancy on October 1, 1814. He had the first wagon to appear in Saline county, Missouri in 1816. He sold his land in Indiana to his father and brother Jonathan after he arrived in Saline county. He, along with Rev. PEYTON, both Baptist Ministers, were the first preachers in the county of Saline. They preached in Cox's and the Big bottom, on Edmondson's creek, and wherever "two or three were gathered together." Thomas was a jocular sort of gentleman, and very popular. He was without literary attainments, but invariably succeeded in preaching his congregation into laughter. Rev. NOWLIN took him to task upon one occasion for his levity. KINNEY answered: "Well, I'd rather preach to laughing devils, than to sleepy ones, as you do! You make them sleep, and I make them laugh. My congregations will pass yours on the road to heaven - and I'll bet you a coonskin they will!" He appeared on the Howard County, Missouri tax payers list of 1817. On Feb. 25, 1820 he appraised a stray taken up by Zachariah HANKS in Missouri. He has been listed as both a minister and a ferryman. Thomas sold 80 acres of property to Gabriel PREWITT on 20 Sept. 1822 in Saline County. It is not popular opinion to state that Lovina AINSWORTH was not the only wife of Thomas, but it is believed with good reasoning (see Note) that she was not the mother of all of the children.

BOTETOURT COUNTY HISTORY

The most complete store of the mid 1700's was operated at Fort Lewis by Alexander Boyd, who was also paymaster for the Virginia Regiment .. as owner of the farming lands adjacent to the Fort he combined his public dutie Good Samaritan Village, Hastings. with his private business. He died in 1766, six years after establishing this business, and his stock, valued at 1092 pounds, 9 shillings, and 5 pence; was acquired by his mortgage holder, Alexander Baine. and the store became known as Baines Store. A complete inventory of the store is listed in Virginia Frontier, by Kegley, and contains everything imagined to be needed by anyone: everything from clark of all source from displaced. to be needed by anyone: everything from cloth of all sorts, from diaper material to damask; blankets, bonnets, hats, hammers, tools and skillets, mirrors, buttons, saddles and bridles, dishes of all sorts, tea, pins, books of all sorts, skins of all sorts, clothing, Bibles, horses and cattle, hardware, and gunpowder, and window glass, to name a few items.

Alexander Baines extended credit to trusted customers, and to the soldiers ily retired in Hastings. as well, with the Captains of companies responsible to see that their men settled accounts....but Mr Baine had some of the same problems with collections the modern merchant encounters. LESTER EUGENE KEENEY RECALLS FAMILY TIES OF AUTHOR JESSE STEWART AND SOPHIE KEENEY IN KY

Lester Eugene Keeney, b.11-2-1915 at Wolf Pen KY, son of Henry Harrison (1893-1967) and Nellie Mae Douglas, and grandson of William H Keeney (1840-1923) & Samantha Pruett, wrote in 1988 from his home in DeLand FL, concerning a memory of JESSIE STEWART, prominent author and brother-in-law of his father Henry and husband of Sophie Keeney.

"In the early 1860's I drove my father to W Hollow and witnessed a conversation between jim and Jesse Stuart about old times in Greenup County", while Sophie, who seemed very shy, brought ice tea to them Henry told a story about a black man who fished with him. One day grandpa told jesse that bis father (Bill) was going to fish with them. No sir, not with me, that's thec meanest whitec man in this country."

Henry told us an interesting story about his marriage to Sophie. He worked on the railroad, a long walk from Wolf Hollow, so he rented a cabin closer. One night when he got home from his job, Sophie was lying on the bed crying. She was homesick for her home in the hollow. As a result her husband built a home in the hollow where they lived the rest of their lives.". My dad died a few years after that. I saw Jesse Stuart a number of times after that and have many letters from him and his books. At the time we could find no trace of a family relationship except that they agreed that their parents probably came from West Virginia. This was confirmed in KEENEY UPDATE, listing William H Keeney as a son of John C Keeney, Jr and arandson of John C Keeney (b.1793 in Kanawha Co) and Elizabeth Farney.



Here's an interesting story written by an Aunt. Adeline Mathilda Keeney was the daughter of James Kimber Keeney & Lucinda B. Pemberton and the granddaughter of William S..Keeney & Jane Simmons

ADELINE MATHILDA KEENEY, IOWA

She was born Adeline Mathilda Keeney on January 13, 1876, in Iowa. She was 16 when she married Grandpa. She adored him (as he did her) and it was a love affair that would last 58 years, until he passed away.

She had a vivid imagination, a quick wit and a zest for living that many people would envy. One of my favorite memories is of telling stories of when she was young. She had a way of telling it so you almost felt like you were right there taking part in it. Besides mothering her own brood (she had six) she mothered all the other kids of the neighborhood. Like so many women of her time, she had a special talent for nursing and for a time when they lived in Beloit, she worked with old Dr. Thayer as a nurse and midwife. She helped many a new life into the world, including several of her own grandchildren.

When we were kids, she was never too busy to play games with us, sometimes making up games if we were bored with the old ones. She always encouraged us to have our dreams, and to follow them if possible. She told me once the only thing to worry about was today, yesterday was gone and tomorrow was not here yet. She had a keen sense of humor, she always could see the humorous side of the situation but she did not treat life lightly.

I remember once when I was about 6 years old, we had a family picnic and during the day she found a nest of pheasant eggs. We had chickens and a broody hen. I do not remember how many eggs or how many chicks were hatched, but she wound up with two, a hen and a rooster. She kept them till they kept flying out of the cage and they were getting so they'd chase us. She took them to a taxidermist and had them mounted. She named them Oscar and Betty and had them yet when I was grown and married. I asked for them after she died, but no one seemed to know what became of them.

She was a fantastic cook and loved nothing better than to have her whole family together for Sunday dinner. She needed no special reason. She loved company and we used to say she opened the door with one hand and put the coffee on with the other.

She loved music and played the mouth organ. She should have been an entertainer, having both the talent and personality. Not long ago, I had the chance to watch the movie Mary Poppins, and I couldn't help thinking that whoever the author was, he must have known Grandma when she was young.
