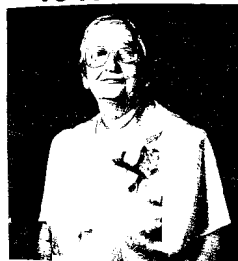

The family consisted of adult married children of James & Sarah GORRELL McDOWELL. The following are the families names: William and Sarah DEVER McDowell, John and Elizabeth PRICE McDowell, James and Sophia HALL McDowell, John and Martha (McDOWELL) CRULL, Woodford and Catherine BENNETT McDowell, Thomas G. and Elizabeth KEENEY McDowell, Hiram and Elizabeth CHALMERS McDowell. Hiram's second marriage was to Sarah MATTHEWS 1837 Montgomery Co. Another sister, Mary McDOWELL PHILLIPS (Mrs. Thomas) may have lived in adjoining Boone Co. There is a McDowell Cemetery NE of Linden, consisting of ONE tombstone with four names engraved, it is likely that the cemetery contains more graves, probably other family members. There are CRULLS buried in Linden Cemetery (cannot connect yet), Oak Hill Cemetery, Crawfordsville and Faubry, IL Cemetery. ### PHILIP KEENEY NAMED 1998 PENN STATE DISTINGUISHED ALUMNUS

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. -- Philip Keeney, professor emeritus of food science and a researcher so identified with ice cream that he is known nationwide as "The Emperor of Ice Cream," has been named a 1998 Penn State Distinguished Alumnus, the University's highest alumni award.

"Philip Keeney has devoted more than 40 years of service to the food processing industry," says Robert Steele, dean of the College of Agricultural Sciences. "His work with ice cream and confectionery products over that time proved to be of major significance to the food industry and to agriculture as a whole."

Keeney, a native of Cedar Grove, N.J., is renowned within the ice cream industry for his breakthrough research on how fat emulsions affect the structure of ice cream during freezing. He also made significant contributions to research on the textural properties of corn syrups and developed microcrystalline cellulose as a texture and structural agent in ice cream.

## Descendents of Simon Keeney

Subject: History of the Keeney Family

Read by Sarah E. Armstrong, Wednesday, Aug. 26, 1896, at the home of Mr. John Jesse Keeney of Creston, Ohio, at the first reunion of the Keeney family.

Our grandfather, Simon Keeney III, was born in East Hartford, Connecticut, Sept. 29, 1790. He came with his fathers family to Fabius, NY, when he was only 5, in the fall of 1795. (He served as a private one year in the war of 1812, receiving near the close of life, a pension for his service.) He then married Miss Polly Daniels, who passed away after 7 years, leaving him with three sons and one daughter. Charles C. Keeney, who married Miss Phoebe Hotchkiss, of Canaan, OH. He lived for a number of years on the "Hough" place east of Canaan, OH., then moved his family to Waverly, Iowa. They reached their destination Oct. 13, 1855. Their first home was a little old log hut that movers had used to stable their horses in when they camped for the night. He was a farmer for a number of years, then went into the hotel business, until poor health and the loss of his wife compelled him to live with his youngest son. He died Sept. 17, 1890. His family consisted of six children. Five sons and one daughter, Albert, Simon, William, Hiram, Sarah Jane, and Sylvester. Only two are left, Simon and Sylvester. Simon came to Ohio and on Aug. 15, 1839 married Miss Phidelia Hays, at Canaan, then moved to Ft. Defiance, OH where he lived and died, Aug. 15, 1841.

Polly Daniels Keeney came to Ohio, stricken with the fever and died at the age of 20. Simon returned to NY where he was again united in marriage, this time to Sarah Shankland, in Fabius NY July 26, 1821. In the fall of 1822 he moved to Ohio, settling on the Killbuck in Coshocton, Co., OH., where they suffered from the disease ague. They again moved to Canaan after a years time. From the time of his emigration to Ohio, his energies were employed constantly toward advancing the general welfare and promoting the community in which he lived. He was also actively engaged in agricultural pursuits.

It may seem to the younger ones here, impossible as they think of the fine roads over which they ride this morning, and the beautiful farms they passed, that when grandfather Keeney came here he could not start out with a fine carriage and go where he would at a rapid rate. Although, he was the owner of many a fine horse, he had to take his axe and cut his way through dense forests and with his oxen team, move logs out to one side first, then drive over and around swamps, when he went to mill or elsewhere.

The first school house to which the Keeney boys went, was located at Canaan. It was built of logs with space enough left between the logs on the sides of the room to admit a row of panes of glass 6 by 10 inches, in size, along one end was a huge fireplace stich the older boys were required to load with fuel, for desks, holes were bored into the logs and wooden pins driven in upon which were laid slabs. The seats were the soft, smooth side of a slab with two wooden legs at each end, which sometimes became loose with constant use and created no end of amusement when one would come out. Of course, the Keeney boys were always busily engaged with their studies and were never on the lookout for fun. The teachers examinations were quite different from nowadays.

The last 20 years of Simon life were spent in darkness, having his eyesight lost by cataracts growing over them. Sarah Vintenia was born in Fabius, NY, 27 Apr. 1822, being only an infant when her parents moved to Ohio. She devoted her time to teaching until her death which took place at the age of 22. Unlita, the youngest daughter, married Solomon Zuvur, and for a number of years, lived in the brick house that stands on the corner in Canaan. He husband engaged in the mercantile business. They went west in the fall of 1855 and invested and lived in Mason City, Iowa. She returned at Ohio and last married Henry Hay of Seville, she died 19 Apr. 1873. All 3 of the sons are farmers following in their fathers footsteps.

THOMAS CANNEY bought land of Capt. Wiggins in Dover in 1634. He was living

in 1671, and had second wife, Jane, in 1655. He lived on the Pascatagua shore of Newington. Children were THOMAS, born before 1645, married Sarah, daughter of Anthony Taylor of Hampton. She married (2) John Wingate. JOSEPH, married Mary Clement. DAUGHTER, married Henry Hobbs. MARY, married Jeremy Tibbets.

Canney, Thomas, b. 1600 in Okeehampton, England, d. 1678, came to Strawberry Bank (Newington), about 1631, had grant at Dover Neck in 1634, had other grants in 1652 and 1656. Signed Dover Combination in 1640: m. (1) before 1635, Mary Looome, b. 1613, m. (2) before 1655, Jane....

THOMAS KINNE (Kenney, Keeney) of Norfolk, England, according to numerous reported sources, had three sons. Two of them, William and John, have been listed with their descendants in the most recent KEENEY UPDATES. These families populated much of Massachusetts, Connecticut and Pennsylvania, as well as New York and midwestern states.

THOMAS II, referred to in New Hampshire archives, chose to go by the name of CANNEY, as did his early descendants.

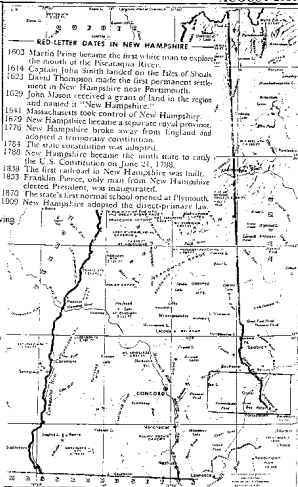
The three sons of Sir Thomas did not come to America together. According to *Names of Strangers & Settlers Sent by John Mason Esq. to Colony of New Hampshire: Thomas Canney was listed as the first settler on Dover Neck, New Hampshire. His birth date was listed as 1611 at Okeehampton. He settled first at Thompson's Point in Dover.*

Thomas was sent to America in 1631, got land from Captain Wiggins in 1634, was listed as a freeman (suggesting that he had "worked off" his cost of passage), was taxed several times between 1648 and 1668, and was alive in 1699, although he had lost his sight.

Although some sources say that the first wife of Thoma Canney is unknown, later sources list his first marriage to MARY LOOME in 1637 and a second marriage to JANE in 1657.

Thomas gave his son JOSEPH real and personal property on 3 December 1669. Later, Thomas Canney III & wife Grace gave land near Thompson's Point, Dover, to his brother Samuel, on 12 August 1703. Thomas had earlier, on 20 February 1640, petitioned with several others the Royal Government of Massachusetts "that we may comfortably enjoy the benefits of His Majesty's laws".

John Mason, benefactor of Thomas Canney, named this new colony for his own English county Hampshire. The colony was 9th in ratifying the US Constitution, the number required to make it effective. This rugged land of mountains (White Mts), forests, rivers and lakes, became the largest of the six states of New England, Concord became the capital in 1808, but Ports-



mouth, Exeter, Hopkintown, Charlestown, DOVER, Hanover and Amherst had their turns as state capital.

The family of HENRY TIBBETS (whose wife was ELIZABETH KENNEY) were very close neighbors of Thomas Canney at Dover Neck. Both Henry & Elizabeth were born in 1596, so it is likely true that Elizabeth was a daughter of Sir Thomas. Henry, who became Dover's lone shoemaker, had come from London to America in 1635 on the ship "JANE". Jeremiah, first son of Henry Tibbets, married Mary Canney, daughter of Thomas and Mary Looome Canney.
