James Keeneey, Jefferson Co. TN Killed In War of 1812

Of the Keeneey brothers who went from Virginia (later WV) to North Carolina (later Eastern Tennessee) after the Indian wars, the family and descendants of JAMES KEENEY are the least known. His name appears with brothers Thomas and John on civil and church records, but his untimely death at Highwassee Garrison during the war of 1812 cut his life short. Although he left a wife and several small children, validating their history has been difficult.

A deed from Thomas and Mary White to JAMES KEENEY was recorded on page 9, Jefferson Co., TN court minutes in January 1793. On December 11, 1820 cash was paid by Mrs. Sarah Keeneey (wife of James), Abraham Keeneey and others on the estate of John White. A few days later, on December 22, court records show that Mrs. Keeneey, her son-in-law Washington Pulse, and twenty three others purchased the White estate in Jefferson County.

JAMES KEENEY was a witness to the transfer of land from JOHN KEENEY, SR. to THOMAS KEENEY, both of Cocke Co., TN on French Broad River in Jefferson Co. in 1806.

JAMES KEENEY, whose younger brothers David, Michael and Moses had remained in West Virginia, had received land in what became eastern Tennessee as a reward for his services along the frontier in the Indian wars. He was born in the 1770's, married and fathered five or more children, and then enlisted on 21 June 1813 for a term of five years as a private in Captain Boherty's Co., 7th Reg. Infantry in Jefferson County. He was killed 20 February 1814 at Highwassee Garrison.

Military records show that James' widow, Sarah (Sally) Keeneey began receiving a military pension on 15 September 1818. This was continued for five years. Listed as heirs, along with the mother, were Isham, Margaret, Alfred, Betsy and Matilda. Henry Hickman was listed as guardian.

Sarah Keeneey appears in the 1830 and 1840 Jefferson Co. census records, but not in 1850. However, a Sarah Hickman, age 70, is listed in the 1850 census as head of household, with one household member, Covington, age 29, listed as a laborer.

On September 15, 1818 Frederick Pulse, Henry Hickman and John McClanahan swore that they had known JAMES KEENEY and his wife SARAH for upwards of ten years before the death of Mr. Keeneey. They had come from Lincoln Co., NC, the report stated. There was no land office in the new state of Tennessee until 1806.

The oldest son of James and Sarah, YSHAM, may have been named for another brother of his father. Tennessee records show that another ISHAM KEENEY, also a veteran of the War of 1812, had participated in the engagement at Horsehoe Bend. Isham survived the

The boyhood days of WILLIAM E. KEENEY were ones of moving. His parents, MOSES KEENEY & FRANCIS HARRIS KEENEY, first lived on adjacent farms with Moses' brother, David, along Muddy Creek, in Greenbrier County. In 1812 William's father made a bid for 171 acres in "the Loop or New River" and the family lived on Ben's Creek (now Wolf Creek) in Giles Co. (now Monroe Co.). In 1814 Moses served on a Giles Co. jury, trav-

elling 75 miles each way to the county seat at Pearisburg. Business also required his presence in Pearisburg in 1816 and 1817. His older sons - Moses W., John C. & David - brothers of William, were also involved in the settlement. Apparently no formal title to the property was obtained, so Moses and Francois took their large family to the Kanawha Valley, settling on Cabin Creek, where William lived and died. Moses was already listed as a property owner in Kanawha, being listed in the 1810 census.

WILLIAM E. KEENEY was born about 1808, since the 1870 census listed him at age 61. He did not survive until 1880. Family members say his burial spot was on the hill at Eskdale, near the school. The cemetery was vandalized years ago.

William m. SARAH R. (Sally) HUFF (born 1815, d. 7 July 1908 at age 93 although news accounts listed her age as 103; the 1900 census listed her age as 87. She was buried on the family farm.

Born to William and Sally were CORNELIUS KEENEY (1835), CAROLINE KEENEY (1837), FOSTER KEENEY II (1838), SAMUEL KEENEY (1841), MATILDA KEENEY (1844), ALVIRA A. KEENEY (1847), WILLIAM HARRISON KEENEY (1849), NANCY KEENEY (1853) and WACHARIAH T. KEENEY (1854).

Entrepreneur to manufacture reduced-risk cigarettes

PETERSBURG — The air conditioner in this tiny, windowless office runs full blast, whirring loudly while it struggles in a heated battle with Southside's heat.

Under the air conditioner sits L. Douglas Keeney — entrepreneur, marketer and an innovator who would change the U.S. tobacco industry.

He is in a study in contrast with down-at-the-beels Petersburg. With his sunburned face and long hair, Keeney, 36, looks more like a California surfer than somebody starting a cigarette company in a dingy factory once used by the Brown & Williamson Tobacco Corp.

He has GQ quality, too. Wire-rims. Tailored gray pinstriped suit. Red club tie. Polished tassel loafers. Red-and-white striped shirt with white collar. Shiny safety pin at the collar.

Keeney is smoking his own cigarette brand and making deals on the telephone. He calls overseas. He then calls his secretary in Louisville, Ky., to antangle a passport problem. He studies a telexed message from Argentina.

Business potential looks so good in Spain, Central America and South America that he studies Spanish with a tutor weekly. He is tired of sounding like a 2-year-old in the language. "Dogg went market. Sell cigarettes."

Of course, Keeney wants to sell cigarettes. He also wants to shake up the tobacco industry. He just might, too, thanks to N-Bloc-

tin. Applied to tobacco, the alcohol compound blocks cancer-causing substances, called nitrosamines, in cigarette smoke, according to Keeney's company, which cites scientific data.

If it works, N-Bloc-tin creates a "reduced-risk" cigarette that could, as his firm's ads say, "change the tobacco industry forever."

"We've always wanted to get the nitrosamines out of there," he said.

"So, you take the whole smoking, and you say, 'What can I do to reduce the biological activity?' Well, I'd like to beat the damned nitrosamines because they're the most abundant. We think they're the most vicious carcinogens and, interestingly enough, they're specific to the lungs."

Keeney Tobacco plans to begin making make these "reduced-risk" cigarettes for export at its Petersburg plant.

Keeney, who serves as chairman of both Keeney Tobacco and its Louisville-based parent, CA Blenders Inc., as chairman, said his company expects annual production of 2 billion cigarettes. The company has a contract to make "reduced-risk" cigarettes for Options Ltd. in Israel and another contract granting Cigarettes La Moderna of Monterrey, Mexico, exclusive rights to sell N-Bloc-tin cigarettes there.

Under the corporate structure, CA Blenders handles the science. It owns the exclusive rights to the N-Bloc-tin technology developed by University of Louisville toxicologists. Keeney Tobacco not only makes its own cigarettes but

does contract work for generic and private labels.

Considering the growth proliferation of no-smoking areas, anti-smoking ordinances, lawsuits against tobacco companies and health campaigns, N-Bloc-tin seems like the answer, or part of the answer, anyway, to the big cigarette companies' problems.

Why didn't they grab this idea before Keeney did?

Keeney has three answers: First, N-Bloc-tin is only part of the answer. It reduces only some risks associated with nitrosamines.

Second, cigarette companies are getting mixed signals from Congress as to what they should do. Keeney advocates clear government and industry policies that aim at cutting smoking dangers.

Third, the sale of "risk-reduced" cigarettes by cigarette companies would imply that other tobacco products carry a risk.

Would he turn away a major cigarette company interested in his technology?

"No. Absolutely not," Keeney said.

Are you talking to these firms?

"No comment." Keeney Tobacco is not selling any "risk-reduced" cigarettes in the United States. Export work has tied up production through the end of the year.

Keeney wants to sell in this country and says no legal or regulatory obstacles stand in his way. However, the company must wait a fine line in describing what the product does to avoid making health claims.

BAY CITY — Dr. Gordon Eugene Richardson, a prominent optometrist and civic leader, died Sept. 27, 1994, at his residence in Bay City.

optometrist in Bay City from 1953 until his retirement in 1982 and he held the record for length of eye one in the city. He was a 48-year member of the Lions Club and served as District Governor in 1975 to 1976. He was a recipient of the Melvin Jones award, had a life membership in the Bay City Lions Club, a life membership in the Texas Lions Camp for Crippled Children and was a past director of the Texas Lions Eye Bank.

"Dr. Richardson has always sat in the front table," Bill Newton, president of the Bay City Lions Club says, "always smiling, always holding out a hand to shake your hand. He was a stepping stone for our Lions Club. He was a very joking fellow and he did a lot of work for the Lions Club. He devoted a whole year of his life to Lionsism when he became District Governor."

Dr. Richardson was born Aug. 8, 1918, in Bay City to Samuel Scott and Ella Leath Johnson Richardson. Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. today at First United Methodist Church with the Rev. Buford Finley of First United

Methodist Church and Rev. James F. Scott, Episcopal chaplain at Seaman's Center at the Port of Houston, officiating. Graveside rites will be conducted under the auspices of the Masonic Lodge and American Legion Post 11 at Hawley Cemetery in Blossing.

A graduate of Texas Tech University and Northern Illinois College of Optometry in Chicago, he practiced optometry in Brownfield and Lubbock after World War II and returned to Bay City to practice.

He served in the 1822nd service command unit of the Medical Department of the Army during World War II.

Active in the civic fraternal organizations, he was a member of the Bay City Lodge No. 865, A.F. and A.M. and a 32nd degree Mason. He belonged to the Scottish Rite Bodies of Galveston, the York Bodies of Lubbock, and Arabia Temple Shrine of Houston. He was made Knight Commander of Honor in the Galveston Consistory in 1965, held a life membership and was a 48-year member of American Legion Post 11, a charter member
