MICHAEL KEENEY/ SUSANNAH RAWLS FAMILY

MICHAEL KEENEY, born about 1765 in Virginia, was an elder son of PETER Keeney (ca.1740- after 1813) of Putnask County, KY. His father had received a Kentucky land grant in 1782.

Michael, commended the Capt. Cornstalk militia in 1798 in Lincoln Co., KY. He was a brother of Daniel, Moses, Abraham, Jesse, James, Betsy Singleton and Sally Burnham. In 1824 he settled with his family in St. Charles Co., MO. He is listed as head of family in Bear Creek Township, St. Charles Co. in 1840.

Michael Keeney was twice married: first on 14 May 1790 in Lincoln Co., KY to Susannah Rawls; secondly to Mrs. Temperance Piper, the widow of John Piper, in Missouri in 1822. The first seven children were born to Susannah: SAMANTHA KEENEY RICHIE 1792-died in IL; HENRY KEENEY 1801-1896 in Linn Co., KS; WILLIAM KEENEY 1809 - buried Summerville, MO; MATILDA KEENEY BACKUS (1812-1850); MICHAEL KEENEY, JR. (1817 in MO, 1893 in TX); ELIZA KEENEY BACKUS (1818 in MO, 1865 in TX); MELINDA KEENEY MOQUEEN (1821-1848 MO) (widow of Temperance).

1. SAMANTHA HEVELLETTA KEENEY was born in Lincoln Co. (now Putnask) KY. She married (1st) Cephus Ritchie, who died in Adams Co., IA, 27 January 1828 when he married Cephus Stow. 2. HARVEY KEENEY, born in KY in 1831, lived in Gasscoade Co., MO, where he served on the staff in 1867 and was the administrator of his father's estate. He and his wife, Julia Ann, are listed in the 1850 Gasscoade census. He died in 1896 in Linn Co., Kansas.

ELIZABETH CATHERINE KEENEY was born 13 June 1847 in Greenbrier Co., VA (now WV), a few weeks before her parents, Moses and Frances Harris Keeney, left the Nuddy Creek settlement to a new settlement on Gibson Creek, in Kanawha County. She is listed in the 1900 census of Ford Co., IL at age 52, living with relatives. She is not listed in 1920.

THOMAS G. McDowell was born 1 February 1826 in Gibson Co., MO, the son of a Scottish father, who engaged in river traffic on the Ohio and Kanawha. He was associated with the salt making industry in West Virginia from 1847 to 1855, where he no doubt worked alongside the Keeney brothers, who were engaged in lumbering and river traffic.

On 1 January 1855 Elizabeth and Thomas emigrated in Kanawha County and almost immediately went to Montgomery Co., Indiana (then) where they lived until 1848. They settled in Ames Township, IL, referred to as Indian Grove (P.O. Palestine), IL, 4 November 1848. There they were listed on a census. All these children, except the last, were born in Indiana:

ANN McDowell was a school teacher, 1877-1880 with her parents, unmarried, in 1866.

FRANKLIN C. McDowell was living in Spencer, IL, Jackson Co., IL before 1860. In 1920 he was listed living there at the age of 90, with his wife, Elizabeth Garton McDowell (b.1840). Their children included: Elizabeth (Marion), b. 1861; Eliza, b. 1862; 1849; Eliza, b. 1870; Eliza G., b. 1874 and married to sugarman (b.8-1874 in England) with son John L. (who married Helen Carlin in Maryland, 1878), b. 1878; in 1928, Etta (b.1901) and Cora (b. 2-1902); daughters listed in the 1910 Spencer, Indiana census: b.1878; Arch McDowell, b.1898, age 24 in 1920, married to Mayne and father of Frances McDowell and Mary McDowell, b.1917.

MOSES KEENEY McDowell settled at Gibson, Jackson Co. in Ford Co., IL. In the 1910 census he was 62 years old, with his wife, Mary, along with her sister Laura and a grandchild. Mary and her sister were still living at Gibson, Missouri, when his wife 70. They are not listed in the 1920 census. They were parents of two sons, Frank (b.1849) and Clarence (b.1-1874), who either died young or left the Illinois area early. WAYNE G. McDowell was apparently the son of Clarence.

hotel, which he operated successfully for years there. Meanwhile he had owned

the ranch. His death occurred September 28, 1922, when he was nearly fifty-eight
years of age. For years he fought a long battle against disease and maintained

determination.

Mr. KERRY was married July 21, 1861, to Miss Elizabeth KERRY, a daughter of
Tom J. and Mary P. Mattick. In 1861 when a child of three, Miss KERRY
contracted the measles with her parents, who settled near Eugene, Oregon. In 1861 he
remained in Eugene, Oregon, and embarked in the sheep business. During the quar-
rantine at Eugene in June, 1862, he was seriously injured and his wife was drowned.
Three days later Elizabeth turned his recovery and search for a dwelling.
Mr. KERRY joined the Elk lodge of Portland but had few occasions to attend

THE GREENBRIER/NEW ENGLAND CONNECTION.

INCONCLUSIVE CLUES

The following clues help link the New England [John] David Keeney to the Greenbrier Co. pioneer, John [David] Keeney. Although they are inconclusive, they do tend to add credence to the theory that the two John David Keeneys are actually one and the same.

1.) One interesting fact is there is no known overlap in the records. The New England records and Greenbrier Co. records do not have a date David Keeney listed in both places at the same time. If the contrary were true and an overlap existed, it would then be possible to conclusively say that the New England [David] Keeney and the Greenbrier Co. pioneer [John] [David] Keeney are two different people. However, because there is no known overlap, we can only say that the lack of an overlap is evidence which inconclusively supports the theory that they are the same individual. At least it doesn't conclusively support the theory that they are not.

The latest known record of David "Keeney" in New England is his marriage to Mrs. Katherine Steward in 1733 in Newbury, Mass., although both were residents in Boston at the time. According to Mrs. Florence Keeney Robertson in "Henry and Ann Kinne, Pioneers of Salem Massachusetts," after the marriage of David and Katherine, they moved from Boston to Middleton, Mass., and there is no further mention of them in her book. However, an inspection of the vital records for Middleton failed to turn up any mention of a David or Katherine "Keeney" (and all spelling variations of the name were checked) nor any mention of a David or Katherine purchase records. The same is also true for the records of Boston and Salem, no further mention after 1733. (Land records, court, probate, and church records have not yet been checked).

This means one of two things, that either David and Katherine lived out their lives in complete obscurity and died in New England without leaving any further records, or they moved away from the area leaving further records of their lives elsewhere.

The earliest known record of John [David] "Keeney" in Greenbrier Co. (then still part of Augusta Co.) is 1749, per the Augusta Co. court records. The next known mention of him is in 1751, his first purchase of land in the Greenbrier river valley.

If the New England and Greenbrier Co. Keeney families are the same, then where John David and Catherine moved and what happened during the sixteen year gap between 1733 and 1749 remains a mystery. Further research may yield some answers.

2.) Another important clue which links the New England and Greenbrier Co. John David "Keeney," is the fact that they are both recorded as being in the British Colonial military. The last known record of David "Keeney" in New England is the earliest references to John Keeney in Greenbrier Co. (then still part of Augusta Co.) is a court order, dated November, 1742, in which a John "Keeney" of Augusta Co. brought suit against a Col. John Smith for withholding of four month's service under the command of Col. Smith. Col. Smith promptly settled the debt with the same money, per the Augusta Co. court records. (Could some one other than an officer sue a British Colonel in the British Colonial Military?)

Another important early reference to the Keeney family of Greenbrier Co. is a 1755 map which shows the Keeney caper, the western most outpost in the New River basin, named as "Keeney's Fort." (Are there other fort references as well which refer to the first Keeney residence as "Keeney's Fort"?) This would indicate that the first Keeney homestead really was a fort, and not just an ordinary cabin. (Perhaps it was called a fort not only for its style of construction, but also because it was "commanded" by a semi-retired (?) military officer.)

The fact that John David Keeney was in the British Colonial military may, in part, explain what happened around so long to start a family. Perhaps Capt. Keeney's military career took him on long expeditions away from home, or perhaps he was stationed at remote outposts on the frontier for long periods, unsuitable for Catherine.

It also may explain, in part, why Capt. Keeney ended up at the western most outpost in the New River basin. He may have initially been assigned there in an official capacity as part of a larger military strategy to protect the western frontier of the Sabine Dolomies from French encroachment, or perhaps asked to go there in some quasi-official capacity as a private citizen, since the New River basin was a disputed territory with the French at the time (British after the conclusion of the French and Indian War in 1763). Only further research on the surviving British Colonial military records can support or refute this theory.

It is self-evident that the Keeney family did survive and thrive in the then hostile wilderness of the Greenbrier Co. This ability to survive must be attributed to more than just luck alone. The pioneer John Keeney probably fort as a military officer would have provided. It is doubtful that years of experience at a farm in the city, could have survived the wilderness, without prior experience and demonstrated skills at survival. Again, as ever, further research is required before this theory can be accepted or refuted.

3.) Another inconclusive clue which links the New England and Greenbrier Co. Keeney families is the similarity in the various early spellings of the name Keeney. The earliest references to the Greenbrier Co. Keeney family. The spelling of the name in its current form seems to have crystallized sometime around the year 1800, one of two generations after Capt. John David Keeney arrived in Greenbrier Co. Although inconclusive, the following clue detracts from theory that the New England [John] David Keeney and the Greenbrier Co. pioneer, John [David] Keeney, are one and the same.

4.) A rather same fact, which tends to relate the theory that the Massachusetts David Keeney and the Bostonian, Capt. David Keeney married Mrs. Katherine Steward, apparently a widow, in 1733. The youngest child of John David and Catherine Keeney of Greenbrier Co., Moses Keeney, was born circa 1766. This is 33 years after Catherine Keeney's second marriage. Assuming she was still very young at the time of her second marriage, she would have probably been in her early 50's, or nearly so, at the time of her youngest child's birth. This fact alone seems almost too incredible to be believable.

However, a point in favor of this being credible is the Bible record which states Catherine Keeney lived to be 104 years old. Obviously, to survive that long in the wilderness of the American frontier, she had to have been a very robust and healthy woman. Perhaps she really did have children into her 50's. It's possible, as incredible as it might be.

Another unanswered question is with the fact that the New England [John] David Keeney and the Greenbrier Co. pioneer, John [David] Keeney, are one and the same.

KeeneY was away from home most of that time pursuing his military career and thus, having a family was impossible. Or, perhaps they did have children during that time who subsequently died young, leaving no records. Or, perhaps there is another "lost" KeeneY generation in between the original Greenbrier Co. pioneer and the subsequent Greenbrier Co. KeeneY family, which I doubt, but a possibility none the less. The speculations are endless. Again, as ever, further research is required.)

Salem Witchcraft Hysteria of 1692

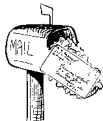
It is apparent that our early KeeneY relatives were involved in the early American tragedy of the Salem witchcraft hysteria of 1692. This involvement is a sad fact, if accurate, that does tend to add a stain to the family name, but the events were in keeping with the times of these early Puritan forefathers. It is suggested that publishing this bit of information in the "KeeneY Update" be delayed until additional investigation can be completed, which may take awhile.

Henry "KeeneY" [Kinn, KeeneY, Keney, Kenn], original immigrant from England and founder of our line of the KeeneY family in America (if we can ever conclusively make the link between W.Va. and Mass.), settled in Salem Village, now Danvers, Mass. in the mid 1600's. It was in Salem Village that the witchcraft hysteria began in late 1691 and continued throughout most of 1692. Before the hysteria was over, everyone in Salem Village had been affected in one way or another. Henry "KeeneY" was living in Salem Village during this entire episode.

After a victim had been accused of witchcraft, they underwent an examination and public hearing to determine whether or not there was sufficient evidence to proceed with a trial. It was during these public hearings that neighbors and fellow villagers could testify to any unusual behavior by the accused, or any unusual occurrences suffered by the witness that they blamed on the accused as the source of their misfortune. Needless to say, these hearings were full of superstition and suggestion, and turned into a circus.

It was during the hearing of Rebecca Nurse, one of the first accused of witchcraft, that the name of "Henry KeeneY" [sic] of Salem Village is recorded as giving testimony. Paraphrasing, he stated that ever since the accused, Rebecca Nurse, had entered the room, he had been afflicted by a terrible pain (Perhaps just suggestion caused by nervous anxiety). Many other villagers gave testimony as well, in addition to the girls riding around in the "pew" claiming they were being tormented by the "witch's specter". The judge found sufficient evidence to have Rebecca Nurse stand trial for witchcraft. She was later tried, found guilty, and hanged.

Further involvement of the Henry "KeeneY" family in this tragedy is not known. It is possible that one or more gave accidental testimony at other hearings, were perhaps a juror at some of the trials, or may have even been accused of witchcraft themselves, as many people were. Only further research will tell. The best place to conduct research into the Salem witchcraft trials is the Essex Institute in Salem, Mass., which has the most extensive collection of books on the subject, including the original trial manuscripts. (In my shock and disappointment at finding this reference, I forgot to photocopy it. My purpose in going to the Essex Institute was non-scientific, for which they also have an extensive collection of books, not the witch trials. I did not pursue investigation into the witch trial connection any further, for lack of time, and because I really don't care to know. Oh, well, history has its low moments too. I may pursue research into this mystery again, but not in the immediate future.)

1595-1656

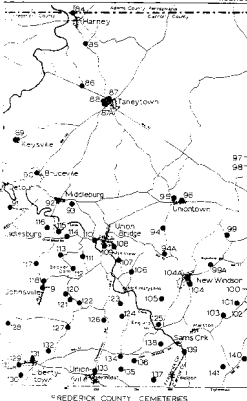
