He was in charge of the business of the railroad at thia point for a number of years, has been a merohent, head oi the Ity government. and is now postmaster.
> Mr. Jarcett was born en Cabin creel. Kaneuthe county, June 26, 1870 . The Jarrett family has beer represented by scucral bxarches of the name in Kandwa county since pioneer times.

inhe paxerts of $U$. S. Barrett wert Addison and Margared (kecny) Jarrett. Nargaret Feeny was a daughter of Menes kelry, rapresenting another old family. Fadison Jirrett spent thirteen years of his life in Missouri, ist. Joseph, and was a member of the nome guard there duking the Civil war. He retucned to Viest Virginia aboit. 1863 and locuted at Cabin Creek. He was a cappenter, ard no woxjed at this erade for thirty yeare with one coal compary. He died at the age of seventy-four and his wife, at geventy. Their two sons were John A.s a former sherift of Kanawha county, and U. S., who was named for ceneral Grant, then President.
U. S. Jarrett attended country schools, at the age of fifteen learned telegraphy, and for tweney yeprs was in the service of the chesapeake 4 Chio Rail road Company as telegraph operator and agent. He was assigned to duty at St. Altans in 1089 as opoxatox, and became agent in 1893 , continuing if that capacity for eight years. when he cark to $5 t$. Albano in 1889 the place had a population of only 1u0. Fineri are Jow between 3,000 and 4,000 poople living in this emmunity, After leaving the cailroad servioe ia 1907 ME . Jurrett. was in the hardware business, was also doputy revenue agent, tor a time resumed wors as $a$ telc. graph opers iop, and during Taft's administration was appointes postmastor. He heid thet office until the change of odministration, and later was called back to rne duties of postmaster for a year and a haif during wilson'a second terfa. Soon after the Harding administantion came in be wos selected as postmmater, and his present zerm began January 1. 1922. The business done by the postoffice while he has been comected with it ie a graphic illustration of the qrowth of $S c$. Albans itself. The receipts of the office are next page.

Mas be you remember that 1 wrote you a couple or years ago about finding proof of the ancentry of Daniel Keeney wio died in 1884 in Wi His death cerificate proved that Fbenezer Keeney and Lois Loch Keency were, ittdeed, his parents: I had been told severat limes that was impowible sating that Fhencer died in 1777 and Daniel wasn"t born until 1799 . This death cortiticate was a reproduction of the orginal hand-written decument in which the names of his patents weec give and was signed by the attending physician Wm H. Hurlbur, M.D. At the time of Datiel s death he was a farmer lixine in Elkborn. WI. Last year, sadly, we lost our dear I orema kenty Goldsworth. F just recolly rucithed a copy of her obit from Wisconsin. I ralize this is a yoat late. but inope you can lind space to print her obsit in your Keeney t/pdute. She was he one who steered mac in the right direction to oblain the conv of the death certificate.
Lorena had been a devoted rescarcher of Keeney history all her adult lite. havite a fantastic memory for detail and kecping her files updated with family information as tone as she lived. She was mocll more than a reseatcher. She was an thy dynamo who liked the expression

BAPTIST CHURCH OF FABIIS. - On the 24th of August, 1803, when there were no roads through this town cast and west, and it was all forest where the village now stands, the Baptist Church of Fabius was recognized by a council composed or delegates sent from Hamilton, Cazenovia, Pompey, and DeRuyter. Elder Ashbel Hommer wa chosen Moderator; and Dr. James Pettit, Clerk. This council, composed of six ministers and nine lay-brethren, convened in a bam three miles south of the village, owned by Samuel Webster, and there recognized this little band of disciples, numbering less than twenty, as a "true church of Jesus Christ." Some of the original members were Thomas Keeney. Samuel Stone, Elijah Keeney, Gurden Woodnuff and Sarmuel Webster.

The house of worsbip of this church was crected at Fabius Village, in the year 1818, and cost about $\$ 5,000$. This year was an eventfil one to the church. They engaged Elder Eliada Blakesly for three years for one thousand dollars, and went with their teams to Connecticut to bring his family and goods, they built thcir meeting bouse, and baptized one hundred and wenty-three converts.

The church was incorporate August 24, 1819. At that time the following Board of Trustees was elected: Flijah St John, Stephen Tripp, Jonathan Stanley, Simon Keeney, Aaron Benedict, John Phelps, Benj. Lewis, Geo. Pettit, Nathaniel Bacon.

Al was born in 1945 . He was brought up in a Roman Catholic farnily, and he was recruited for the priesthood beginnirg a pre-seminary program in tus late teens. Turning to the study of spesch at Loyola University of Chicago, he received his bachelor's degree in 1968 . 11 was in his theater work at Loyola that Al met his future wife, linda. He went on to receive an MA in pramatic ans at St. Louis Universily in 1970.

Louis, Missouri His writing talent and some free-lance work ted him to the advertising and rsarketing side of eommunication. Afier a stint with two companies in the St Louis area and a pericd working in Indianapolis, he transferrod to New Jersey, where he held several executive postions in the marketing field, rising to the position of vice-president of Cooper Communibations, in Maplewood. NJ Meamwhle. Linda and Al had two sons (now both grown. ages twenty-nine and wwenty-two. anid living in Denver). It was dueing thear time in New Jersey that a time of personal crisis led Al to reevaluate his interests and priorities in life and reconsider his earier vocstion to ordained ministry. As a postulant from the Diocese of Newark, Al was admitted to the Master of Divinity program at Drew University, from which he recelved his seminary degree in 1990.
