Salmon Keenee's Visit to Michigan in 1827

Many years ago these Michigan History resources centers and others of greater days in order to preserve in the words of the writer to new feelings and thoughts and to make such information available to the students of Michigan history and to the general reader. Happen, Salomon Keenee little thought that one hundred and thirty years after he wrote the description of his trip from Pennsylvania to Michigan his story would be printed for future generations to read.

Salomon Keenee was the fifth generation of his family in the United States. Early in the seventeenth century, Mark and John MacKeene, brothers, emigrated from Scotland and settled in Chester, Vermont. Soon after arrival the prefix was dropped and the name became as Keenee. Mark Keenee and his sons, Judson and Richard, settled in northwestern Pennsylvania on the Susquehanna River in what is now Wyoming County. They made the trip on foot from Elizabeth, Connecticut, in 1727 or 1728. In 1780 Judson returned to Connecticut to marry Phoebe Storer. Judson and Phoebe had the sons and five daughters, including a son of seven girls. Salomon, the third child of the family, was born July 23, 1794. He married Mary Corbin on March 8, 1812. They had five children. The year following his trip to Michigan Salomon Keenee brought his family to Skowrone County in the eight acres of land situated in Section 9, Township 3 North, Range 3 East, which he had purchased on July 13, 1827. In 1834 he bought forty acres in Erie Township, Town 8 South, Range 3 East of Section 7.

Salomon taught a spelling school the first year and a day school continued on next page)

William Henry Kenney

Mr. Henry Kenney was born in Goshen, Madison Co., Ky., in the year of Our Lord 1728, and he was married to Mary A. Kenney, on June 14, 1771, at Newmarket, Va. He had several children, but only three are known to have survived. Two more years after their marriage, the family moved to reside in Indiana. Over 100 years ago they came to Indiana which has been their home ever since, although, for better reasons, they have made their home temporarily in West Virginia.

Mr. Kenney died at his home in Goshen, June 14, 1854, after an illness that began several years previous. Due to his death, the ownership took one of his oldest children and the village one of his enterprising business men, Dr. Henry and J.T. Ryan purchased the Goshen Drug Store on June 1, 1860. Mr. Kenney had provided medicine in Goshen for 40-50 years, with his wife helping during his absence to make preparations. Mrs. Kenney continued to help her husband after her husband's death. Six children had preceded Dr. Kenney in death. He was buried at Campbell, Va.

Don McGlothlen 14 October 2013 transcription of General George E. Keeney article from page 1 of Keeney Update, Volume 2, Number 4, September 1985:

“General George E. Keeney, son of Rockwell Keeney, was born March 22, 1849, at South Manchester, Connecticut. After working his way through Cheshire Military School, he joined his father and brothers in the woolen mill business, which operated under the name of R. Keeney and Sons until 1883, when it became the Somersville Manufacturing Co. From 1845 to 1900 he was president of Hartford Life Insurance Co. Elected twice to the state senate, he married Helen Benison (DCM: Denison?) on August 12, 1873. His children were Elizabeth (Mrs. Lewis Gordon, vice president of Hartford Life), Raymond G., Yale graduate and vice president of Hartford Life, and Laure (Mrs. James Moore).

General Keeney was a 7th Generation Keeney in America and a direct descendant of Alexander Keeney, pioneer settler. Alexander’s son Joseph was the father of Ashbel Keeney I, and was father of Ashel (DCM: sic) II, who was father of Ashbel III, who was father of Rockwell Keeney. Members of this family are still engaged in medicine and business in the New England states.”
