nation-wide, for the book covering the Moses Keeney family, a main source was Georgia Keeney, 67 year old retired govern-

ment worker of 40 years, whose efforts had covered the same territory. Due to the scattering of Greenbrier settlers during the Indian wars, there was a big gap in record keeping.

Miss Keeney wrote 13 January 1972: "Information is very meager on his (Moses) children. Records say there were ten, including David A., Moses, Foster H., Stiles, William E., Michael R., John, Hamilton, Ruth and one more."

Her conclusions were 70% correct; she listed correctly all seven sons. Hamilton and Ruth, however, were members of the Da-

TENNESSEE

MEXICAN WAR
Letter to Chattanooga (TN)
Gazette
30 December 1859

When moored here in the summer of 1846, we saw no relic of the Cherokee race which had been removed hence by General Winfield Scott, eight years previously, to their appointed lands West of the Mississippi River. But here were Lookout mountain looking down in majesty of the scenes beneath, and the mighty tide of the Tennessee river rolling ceaselessly on its Westward course, and the long stretching Missionary Ridge, since become famous in the Nation's History and the potent Cumberland Mountains, mighty repositories of coal of the value of untold billions and the teeming plain busy with manufacturers and commerce, and a city's population with all its diversified interests under the high pressure of the present day. How changed in 1846 our sojourn was brief. Soon we cut our cables and floated successfully through the perilous waters of the raging Tennessee, thence down the Tennessee, the Ohio and the Father of Waters and thence on shipboard, across the Gulf of Mexico to the land of strife, the sunny but was like realm of Mexico. But this is going beyond the intended scope of this letter. We intended but to dwell a moment on the sojourn at Chattanooga for a brief time in 1846. Of the gallant men of Anderson Company enlisted for service in the Mexican War. Alas! How many of those daring spirits breathed their last in that far off land. The noble Captain Kirkpatrick who expired under the roar of hostile guns at the siege of Vera Cruz, and William England and George W. Keeney who died instantly pierced by Mexican balls in the bloody charge of Cero Gordo, and Lieut. Hogsett, and others we cannot now name in this hour of haste. But I shall send to you for publication in your valuable Gazette a complete muster roll of the Anderson County Company of that almost forgotten day.

Barnaby C. Keenev Is Dead at 65; Ex-Brown University President

RHODE ISLAND

Dr. Barnaby C. Keenev, the 12th president of Brown University and the first chairman of the National Endowment and Council on the Humanities, died of a stroke Wednesday at Rhode Island Hospital in Providence, He was 65 years old.

As president of Brown from 1965 to 1969, Dr. Keenev was the architect of the university's greatest period of educational and physical growth. During his tenure Brown's operating budget tripled; its endowment doubled and 11 major building projects that cost a total of \$22 million were completed.

"Brown University owes an incalculable debt of gratitude to Barnaby Keenev," Howard E. Swaine, the current president of the university, said yesterday. "During his 20 years here, he left his imprint on every aspect of university life."

Dr. Keenev, a blunt, outspoken scholar who specialized in medieval history, had little tolerance for "intellectual dogmatism and rhetoric. 'I never hurt anyone's feelings, on purpose.' He once said dryly, 'usually, of course, I'm trying to offend.'"

Finishing the Best

Dr. Keenev was concerned about students and what happened to them after their graduation. "At college age, you're a little inebriated with intellectual indignity and rhetoric. 'I never hurt anyone's feelings, on purpose.' He once said dryly, 'usually, of course, I'm trying to offend.'"

Dr. Keenev was born in Halfway, Ore., on Oct. 17, 1934, and received a Bachelor of Arts degree at the University of North Carolina in 1956. He earned his master's at Harvard University in 1957 and his doctorate at Harvard in 1960.

Dr. Keenev became a history instructor at Harvard after completing graduate work. In 1960 he joined the Army and served in Europe as an infantry captain. He was awarded the Silver Star, the Bronze Star and Purple Heart.

He went to Brown as an assistant professor of history in 1960, became a professor in 1963 and made a name for himself as its administrative hierarchy.

When he left Brown in 1969, Dr. Keenev was chosen by President Johnson to head the National Endowment and Council on the Humanities, an organization designed to attract some of the nation's funds then lavished on the sciences.

The Pleasure in Giving

"It's easy to raise money if you have a good cause," he said in an interview shortly after taking over the endowment post in 1969. "I think about it as the pleasure you give people."

Disappointed by President Nixon in 1970, Dr. Keenev served for a year as chief executive officer of the Washington Center for Graduate Schools. He then became president of the Claremont Gradu-

ate University in Claremont, Calif., a post he held until his retirement in 1978.

In 1978 the now defunct New Times magazine published an article contending that the Central Intelligence Agency had secretly sponsored Dr. Keenev as chairman of the "Human Ecology Fund," which the article described as one of many dummy corporations that channeled "millions of dollars into mind control projects, including LSD testing on human subjects."

Dr. Keenev concluded that he had worked for the C.I.A., but refused to disclose the nature of the work.

"Doing What I Should"

"It is improper to attempt to serve your country," Dr. Keenev said, "and if I felt it was doing what I should, I am a citizen of this country. I will do that whatever it is asked."

John Staudfeld, deputy director of Central Intelligence, said later that there was no indication that Dr. Keenev or anyone else at Brown was involved with the ecology fund.

Dr. Keenev, who lived in Little Compton, R.I., is survived by his wife, the former Mary Elizabeth Critchfield; a son, Thomas Keenev of Washington; two daughters, Barbara Clark of Santa Cruz, Calif., and Elizabeth Barnaby Keenev, a student at the University of Wisconsin, and three grandchildren.

A memorial service will be held at noon Monday at the Central Congregational Church, 256 Angell Street, Providence.

17, 1914 at Halfway, Oregon. His father, Robert Mayo Keenev, was a metallurgical engineer. His mother is the late Maud Barnaby Conrad, nee of Elizabeth Goodall, a descendant of two old Rhode Island families.

The grave of his mother took the family to Christ Hill, Connecticut. Barnaby C. Keenev graduated in 1956, graduated from Public High School, where he had been president of the student council, captain of track and cross-country team and state quarter-mile champion.

At the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill, he was a member of Phi Kappa Phi. Elected to Phi Beta Kappa, he was president of the university chapter in his junior and senior years. He ranked first in his class in 1956, the highest rating in his class. His fraternity is Sigma Chi. Under a fellowship, Keenev studied medicine at the University where he received the M.A. degree in 1957 and the Ph.D. degree in 1960. His doctoral thesis dealt with the development of the perception of individual rights against an arbitrary state.

After three academic years at Harvard as an assistant and later as an instructor, Keenev entered the U.S. Army. He was sent to Fort Eustis, Virginia for basic training and attended Officers Candidate School at Camp Davis, North Carolina. He served as an instructor team of the 10th Infantry Division. After graduation he was assigned to the 10th Infantry (Airmobile (The Bulge) and Central Fire, he was the Silver Star "for gallantry in action," and the Purple Heart "for meritorious service." He was discharged from the Army in 1964 with the rank of captain.

At Johns Hopkins University following discharge from the Army, he received his Ph.D. which was published as *Judgment by Force* (University of Chicago Press, 1961). In 1960 he joined the Brown University faculty as assistant professor of medieval history, becoming associate professor in 1962, a full professor in 1963. In 1968, on the age of thirty-four, he became associate dean of the Graduate School and the year following he was elected to succeed on him the M.A. degree of residence in 1970.

As dean of the Graduate School, Keenev worked to attract "top quality" applicants and was successful in obtaining several titles from foundations.

On August 10, 1955 Barnaby C. Keenev was elected president of Brown University and took office immediately. He was officially installed as Brown's twelfth president on October 21, 1955. At the time of his acceptance of the post in August he had stated: "We are in the business of educating people, and we are to do it and to act in a balanced way. It does not make any sense to allow ourselves to be run by an engineer, a businessman, or a politician. We should have all these capacities. The best I know of is to run a university in a liberal atmosphere. Our experimental curriculum and the developments that will grow from it are new and different from the traditional" (*Christian Science Monitor*, August 12, 1955).

A believer in equal educational opportunity for all Americans, Keenev wrote that "It is impossible to educate anyone. All that one can do is create the conditions under which one can find an education." He feared that the "ablest" were sent into colleges "in the next few years, and that the rest of the population will be left to fend for itself, without any education." He has said that a liberal education gives a student "the best chance to develop a talent most that he or she is capable of using."

"Universities can help preserve freedom of thought in a world where the state is taking out people who know it, a position where he can't do anything but express themselves clearly." He has also said that "it was our opportunity to experiment with ideas."

Dr. Keenev is a member of the American and Rhode Island Academies of Arts and Sciences, the Medical Academy of America, and American Association of University Professors; a trustee of the American Bar Endowment and a member of the board of the Rhode Island Society of Design and secretary to the board of the George A. and Alice Clara Howard Foundation. He is a member of Central Congregational Church. His clubs in Providence are the Art, Rowing, and Rowing Fights.

Dr. Keenev married Mary Elizabeth Critchfield on June 27, 1941. Their children are Barnaby C. Keenev, Jr. and Elizabeth Keenev. For relaxation Keenev enjoys gardening, fishing, and just "sitting and thinking." He has a pet dog named "Honey" and a pet and destructive striver, the *New Yorker*, *Atlantic Monthly*, and *Harper's Magazine*.

He was for two years (1947-1948) assistant editor of *Speculum*, published by the Medical Academy of America, and has served on a number of boards of trustees.

- 27 Feb 1658 Anne Keene of Bristol, spinster, and Hannah Morgan, bound to Phillip Roberts to serve 4 to 6 years
- 2 June 1659 William Hudson of Shipton Glos, blacksmith, bound to John Keene, blacksmith, to serve 4 years in Barbados

Henry Kinne, Pioneer of Salem, Mass.,

Henry Kinney(s), the American progenitor of an extensive and honorable line of early New England and New York pioneers and their descendants, was the son of John Keene and Sarah Crooker and the grandson of Sir Thomas Keene Baronet of Kings Lynn, Co. Norfolk, England. (See "The History of Henry Kinne through 225 generations." He was born July 8, 1623 in King's Lynn, and baptized May 3, 1624 in Lyden, Holland, where his Puritan parents had gone to escape religious persecution. The name appears in early colonial records under various spellings as Keny, Kene, Kinne, Koyney, Kenney, Keenue, Kine, Keene, etc. In a deed given by Henry Kinne the name is spelled six different ways the same document. The English spelling for several hundred years previous is simply Kene, and the Milesian spelling, "Cineadh" (d is silent), for instance, Oo-Cineadh; Kil Keenuy. Cf Hall was the home of Cineadh or Keenue. This Cineadh was the first written form of the family name as yet found. (See Our Family Name. According to Pope's Pedigrees of Massachusetts, his name first appears in Roxbury, June 21, 1638, when, as Henry Keenue, he was apprenticed to Wm. Park by Vincent Potter, who was presumably a relative, and who brought him from Holland in May, 1635 by way of London on ship "Elizabeth and Ann" which sailed for the New World April 29th of that year. As Henry Kony and Kony he appears in Ipswich, Mass., records in 1641. In Salem vital records, his name appears twice as Keeney; as signer of a court petition in Salem Village, Oct. 10, 1667 as Henry Kene; on the church roll of founders who voted Dec. 28, 1672 to build a meetinghouse, as Henry Keeney; and in various forms in other Salem records and the documents of Boston State House, but usually as Kinne or Kinney.

He was a planter in Salem, now Danvers, Essex Co., Mass., as early as 1648. The site of his house is within the location of Boston and Newburyport turnpike, about midway between Preston and Nichols Streets. In 1666 "The Henry Kinne House About sixty acres of surrounding land was conveyed to him Feb. 26, 1667. This house was destroyed by fire in the summer of 1696. He was taxed in 1652 and a constable in 1686. He was a very religious man and officiated at church services.

He was a soldier under Major Soldevick about 1654 at the taking of St. John from the French. He was at the capture of Fort Narragansett with Capt. George Currier's Co., Dec. 8, 1678, and drew pay Jan. 24, 1679 for military service. Podge in his "Early Records of Ipswich" gives his name under the following dates. Feb. 29, 1676, July 24 and Sept. 23 of that year and April 24, 1677 as "of Salem town." He and son, Thomas were both at Mt. Hope during King Philip's War.

He is probably the same Henry Kinne who d. June 18, 1696 in Newbury, Mass. (v. r.). A quit-claim deed from his youngest son, Henry to his oldest son, John, dated June 6, 1712, refers to him as deceased, hence same records give 1712 as the possible year of his death. Doubtless he was tied to the old country in Danvers on land once owned by him and not far from the house where Gen. Israel Putnam was born in 1718.

He married Ann— who as his wife was admitted to Salem Church, Aug. 24, 1654. She died 1690. Several published biographies state she was Ann Howard, born 1632, dau. of Thomas Howard of Aylesford, Co. Kent, England who came with his wife, Susannah and five children to Ipswich, Mass., March 17, 1634. He was a tailor — made freeman May 1678; b. about 1630 and died, April 23, 1696 at Ipswich. But other records say Ann Howard d. unmarried

that Henry Kinne married 12th day 10th month, 1649 Ann Putnam. She is presumed to be the same Anne Putnam who was baptized Feb. 4, 1629-30, Greenwich, Kent, Eng., dau. of Edmund, (Edward) Putnam of Greenwich and his wife Anne Compton, who were married Feb. 10, 1623-4 at Greenwich, Eng. As the Kinne and various Putnam families were close neighbors in Salem, this latter supposition seems logical and is presumably correct.

Henry m. (?) Miss Anne Law of Haverhill, Mass. She was the widow of John (James) Lane who was killed at Concord Bay Sept. 13, 1688. She was probably the "Old Widow Kinney" buried in Salem, Sept. 12, 1712, according to Rev. Geor's Diary.

The children of Henry and Ann Kinne, as recorded in Salem, v. r. are, John, b. Jan. 11, 1651-2 "m. June 17, 1675, Elizabeth Lookoe, Thomas, b. March 11, 1652-6 "m. May 23, 1677, Elizabeth Knight, Hannah, b. March 2, 1654-7 "baptized Jan. 2, 1653-4 of whom no further record, Mary, b. May 3, 1658, m. Dec. 13, 1677, Wm. Thibault, Sarah, b. June 20, 1661, bapt. June 28, 1661, of whom no further record, Elizabeth, b. Dec. 1662, bapt. May 1, 1664, m. 1683, John Dale Lydia (Lisal), b. April 1666, bapt. May 12, 1668, no further record, Henry, Jr., b. May 1, 1669, m. (?) May 18, 1691, Priscilla Lewis, (?) May 14, 1696, Mrs. Moseley (Mary) Wright (1) Sept. 18, 1716, Mrs. Mary (Louise) Curdick.

"The dates until the 3rd of Sept. 1716 in the old ecclesiastical and other records are old style dates and eleven days must be added to bring into new style. Also, the year 1656-7, for example, means the ecclesiastical year 1656 and the civil year 1657. The ecclesiastical year began on the 25th day of March—the civil year on the first of January. Hence this double way of writing the year is found in January, February and March to the 24th.

John Kenney (Henry) (Kinney) (Kinne) (Keenue) (Keeney) (Kiene) of Salem was born Jan. 11, 1651-2 at Lyden, Holland, but settled in Salem in 1654 at Salem where he appears as John Keening in the church baptismal records. He removed to Newbury after 1691 and was living there in 1710. In 1664 he and wife were members of Topsfield Church. He enlisted in King Phillip's War, Oct. 24, 1676.

Thomas Keeney was b. ca. 1780 and d. before April 1846 in Holt County, Missouri. m. Nancy Fugate who died after 1832.¹⁰² He is said to be the son of John (Johnathan) Keeney Sr. who was b. ca. 1759 and d. 1821 in Jefferson County, Tennessee and his wife Annie Elizabeth Poets.

LAND section 15 township 40 range 25 containing 68.8 acres (St. Clair). This tract is east of Lowry City on Muddy Creek.

Thomas Keeney appeared a stay in February of 1820 that had been taken up by Zachariah Hanks in Canton Twp. of Howard Co. On 20 September 1822 Gabriel Frewitt sold for \$100 to Thomas Keeney 80 acres in E½ of NE¼ of S21-T30-R19. Wm. Peyton Nowlin, Ann Edwards, and Joshua Looney.¹⁰³

Thomas Keeney was listed on the 1830 Saline co. Missouri Census. p. 233. 1 male 20-30, 1 male 40-50; 1 female 5-10, 2 females 10-15, 2 females 15-20, 1 female 20-30, 1 female 40-50. He was listed on the 1840 census of Rivers county next to Edward Mulholland, p. 356. He was listed with 2 males 15-20, 1 male 20-30, 1 male 30-60 and 1 male 80-90; two females 15-20 1 female 20-30 and 1 female 40-50.

On 22 August 1832 Thomas Keeney and wife Nancy of Saline and William W. Kavanaugh of Jackson Co. Missouri for \$1250 sold 267 acres being the E of NE of E of NE of 21-30-19 adn W of NW of Section 22, W of SE of Section 21 and 27 acres off the North end of the W of SW of 22 in above named township and range. Wit: -& Brown.¹⁰⁴ On 6 February 1838 Thomas Keeney mortgaged to Rivers Co. 100 acres in parts of Section 16-40-25. Edward Mulholland mortgaged the same property at the same time.¹⁰⁵

Indenture dated 31 May 1843 by John Nave acting as trustee for Thomas and his wife Loving Keeney, sold to Henry Nave W½ of SW¼ 15-40-25 and part of NE fractional north of Grand River 21-40-25 containing 140.79 acres.¹⁰⁶ On 7 March 1842 Thomas Keeney and Lovinyia his wife of Henry Co. sold to Henry of Saline and John Nave of their part also of Henry mortgaged to Henry Nave to keep him harmless for a note executed by Keeney, he mortgaged the W of West of 15-3-25 (paper town) and N and WE ½ of NE 21-40-25 71.90 acres, altogether 140.71 acres. Wit: Whit Holland & Edward Mulholland. No release.¹⁰⁷

With Edward Mulholland, he was security for the estate of Russell Morgan under administration of Russell M. Morgan in 1836. He was probably the brother of Russell's wife, Catharine and Edward's wife Patsy.

HOWARD W. KEENEY, a successful farmer and dairyman of Cuyler, is a son of John A. and Lots (Whitmarsh) Keeney, and was born in Cuyler township, this county, June 13, 1857.

His great-grandfather, Deacon Simon Keeney, in 1795 moved from the State of Connecticut to Central New York and settled in the town of Fabius, Onondaga County. He was the founder of what is now known as Keeney's Settlement. He was also one of the founders of the Baptist Church in Fabius.

Grandfather John Keeney was born in 1797 in the town of Fabius, where he spent his life engaged in farming. He died in July, 1878, at the age of seventy-six years. He was a member of the Baptist Church and was noted for his hospitality. He was united in marriage to Ann Conable, who died August 31, 1862. They were the parents of ten children, five sons and five daughters. John Keeney was a man of good character, and was esteemed as an honest, upright citizen.

John A. Keeney, father of our subject, was born at Keeney's Settlement, May 16, 1820, and spent the greater part of his life tilling the soil. February 28, 1844, he married Lois Whitmarsh, who was born in Cuyler, March 18, 1819. Shortly after his marriage, he moved to the town of Cuyler, where he lived until 1862, and where all his children were born. He then returned to his native town and retired from active life in 1876. In connection with farming he dealt extensively in live stock, butter and cheese. Politically, he was a Republican. He was a member of the Baptist Church, and held several positions of prominence. He was the father of four sons and one daughter, as follows: Oscar J., born April 6, 1845, died in 1849; George A., born January 12, 1849, married Esther Pope, and now resides in Elizabeth, New Jersey, where he is manager of the Lubricating Department of the Tide Water Oil Company; Mary E., born March 24, 1851, is the wife of James H. Andrews, of Syracuse, N. Y., where Mr. Andrews is engaged in the grocery business; Howard W., who heads this personal sketch; and Dr. John H. of Oswego, who was born August 10, 1859, and received his education in Batavia and the Homeopathic College of New York City.

Howard W. Keeney received a common school education, which was continued at Cazenovia Seminary and was engaged in teaching in this county. In 1879, he went to the State of Illinois, where he taught for some time; returning, he engaged in farming in Cuyler township and has remained there
