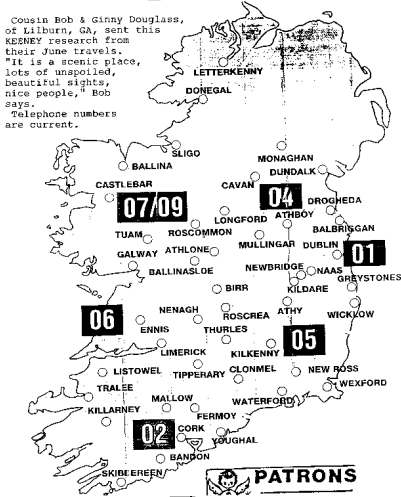

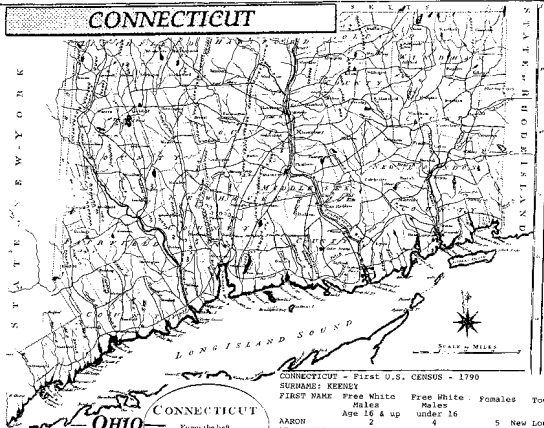

## ROBERT HENRI DIES; ILL EIGHT MONTHS

Eminent Artist Succumbs in St. Luke's Hospital After Long Siege of Neuritis.

### NOTED PAINTERS HIS PUPILS

He Was Ranked by Experts Among Three Most Important Figures in Modern American Art.

Robert Henri, eminent American artist, died early yesterday morning at St. Luke's Hospital. Although he had been a patient at the institution since November, his illness was not generally known and his death came as a surprise to art circles.

Early in November while on route to his summer home at Southport, Me., he had been a patient at the institution since November. His illness was not generally known and his death came as a surprise to art circles. Although confined to bed for eight months and unable to paint, he was never depressed, but enjoyed the visits of friends, and in turn kept his callers amused. Gradually he became weaker and a short time before his death, which occurred at 3 o'clock yesterday morning, was due to a sudden cardiac attack.

Mr. Henri was one of the most conspicuous figures in contemporary American art. Last Spring, when the Arts Council of the City of New York gave the award of American Artists, collectors, dealers and museum officials as to the 100 most important living American artists, Mr. Henri was one of the three who headed the list.

**Famous Artists His Pupils.**  
Aside from his own paintings, Mr. Henri was conspicuous as a teacher and, especially as a champion of American Art.

Always the friend of young artists, he lost an opportunity to do the deserving, but he declined to further the causes of those whose work he deemed superficial. He was the guiding spirit of the late George Bellows, and among his other pupils was Ruckwold Kent. As a teacher he was able to inspire his pupils to work. Although a member of the National Academy of Design, Mr. Henri never became a member and, seven years ago was called a "leader of the insurgents." In recent years he had become so dissatisfied with the conservatism of the Academy that, although he did not resign from the organization, he declined to show his paintings in its exhibitions.

Mr. Henri was born in Cincinnati, Ohio, on June 25, 1865, a son of John and Theresa Henri, of French, English and Irish descent. Educated in public and private schools in this city, Cornell and Drexler, he began to study art at the age of 20 and soon entered the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts in Philadelphia, Pa. Subsequently he studied in Paris at the Academie Julian and at the Ecole des Beaux Arts. After a period of independent study in Spain he returned to this country and became a teacher in the Philadelphia School of Design.

Opened Art School in Paris.

Subsequently Mr. Henri opened a school in Paris, at which he urged

his pupils to develop their own individuality. His teachings were seen often in the salon of the Champs de Mars; and in 1899 the French Government purchased from the salon for the Luxembourg Gallery his canvas "The Nigger."

In 1900 Mr. Henri returned to this country and opened a studio in New York. He was not long in gaining recognition. One of his paintings won a medal at the Pan-American Exposition in Buffalo in 1901. This was one of a long series of awards which brought him more and more into the public eye. The latest such distinction came to him last January when his canvas, "The Wise Woman," won the Temple Gold Medal for the best painting in the exhibition of the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts, in which more than 400 artists showed their work.

Some years after opening a studio here, Mr. Henri became an instructor in the New York School of Art, founded by the late William M. Chase, but after a few years severed his connection with this institution. He was one of the leaders of the group which arranged the famous "Salon of Modern Painting" here, and was one of the leading spirits of the Society of Independent Artists.

**His Work in Many Museums.**

His work is represented in all the leading museums of this country, and in many private collections of contemporary art. The Metropolitan Museum owns his "The Spanish Gypsy," and he is represented in the Brooklyn Institute by "Laughing Girl" and "Landscape."

Mr. Henri was married twice. His first wife was married in 1888, was Linda Craig, daughter of T. Howell Craig of Philadelphia. She died in 1903, and three years later he married Marjorie Organ of this city, herself an artist. He is survived by his widow and a brother of Philadelphia.

In addition to painting, Mr. Henri also wrote on art subjects. His best known work is "The Art of the American Inventor," a series of lectures and advice to students, embodying his art beliefs. He was a member of many art organizations, including, in addition to the National Academy of Design, the Society of Independent Artists, the Society of American Artists, the National Institute of Art and Letters, the National Art Club and National Society of Portrait Painters.

The body will be cremated and the ashes interred in the family vault in Philadelphia.

## IT BEGAN IN MALDEN, (now WEST) VIRGINIA

The West Virginia Turnpike (I-64 & I-77) runs right by the GATEWOOD cemetery at the mouth of Slaughter's Creek, at Chelyan. Ransom (1772-1843) & Elizabeth Burke Gatewood, settled at this site before 1810 after leaving Amherst Co., VA.

Sons William Ambrose Gatewood (1801-1866) and Robert Burke Gatewood (1808-1876), as well as daughter Mary Gatewood Murray (1806-1880s) had been born in Amherst County. ELIZABETH (Betsy) GATEWOOD (1811-1882), who married MICHAEL R. Keeney, and her sister, MILBRED (Milly) GATEWOOD, who married Stires J. Keeney, were born in Kanawha County.

Tracing the genealogy of the Gatewood children has been relatively easy, except for son Robert.

The 1850 and 1860 census reports for Kanawha County show Robert, who had married Julia Ann Jones on 4 Dec 1834, living at Kanawha Salines (Malden), assisting Robert Jones, a brother-in-law, in operating a hotel. They had five small children between 1835 and 1852. Then the whole family disappears from the census records.

Before the 1860 census Theresa Gatewood had wed John J. Cozad, a Vinton, OH native who had left home at the age of 12 to seek adventure. During the 1849 Gold Rush he had gone to California with a gambling partner who later became governor of that state. On his return East he stopped at the hotel at Malden, where he became enamored by Theresa, daughter of the Gatewoods. The courtship and marriage was picturesque, with many amusing incidents. Cozad appeared for the wedding in grey striped trousers, frock coat with blue lapels, and grey beaver hat. The honeymoon took them to Hawk's nest and "Sulphur Springs".

None of these details were known until the writer began searching, after reading in another book that John J. Cozad was the subject of a western story by Marc Sandoz, "SON OF THE GAMBLIN' MAN". The library computer showed that two copies of the book were available in West Virginia and, through an inter-library loan, one copy was secured. Actually Mr. Cozad turned out to be the gambling man and the son, who later became one of America's most renown artists, was the son for whom the book was written.

Through this research it became plain that the Cozads, her parents and her brother Traber and perhaps others, had followed the river and had settled near Cincinnati in a town called Cozadale. Shortly afterward Cozad's "empire building" tendencies led him to the Platte River valley of Nebraska, where he claimed new land in Indian country and set up a town called Cozad, Nebraska. The elder Gatewoods and Traber were with the Cozads and assisted greatly in running a hotel and all the other details that go with pioneer living.

Cozad took frequent trips - often to Cincinnati as well as to California and Denver. He was a champion gambler, but did not gamble around his family.

Other settlers were jealous of Cozad, particularly when he tried to get the county seat of Dawson County moved to Cozad and sought to build a sod bridge over the Platte River. In one skirmish he accidentally shot a protestor, who died later. After this Cozad fled Nebraska, once returning to try to clear himself, but was not cleared until years later because of the efforts of his brother-in-law Traber Gatewood.

Cozad took the alias Robert Henry and lived in Atlantic City and New York, while sending his sons to medical and art schools. Theresa accompanied him and lived the rest of her days in New York. Son John finished medical training and had a successful practice in Philadelphia. Son Robert, who studied in France and took the alias Robert Henri, became the world renowned artist, never again going by the name of his father. His obituary in the NEW YORK TIMES names his parents as Mr. & Mrs. Robert Henry. Obviously TIMES writers knew little of his adventurous past; nor did they know the Cozad-Gatewood story began in Malden, WV.

Thousands of descendants of Elizabeth Gatewood KEENEY, Mildred Gatewood KEENEY, and Eliza Gatewood (Mrs. Foster) KEENEY can trace their families to the world-renowned artist, Robert Henri.

## Nevada Doctor Tells True Story In Article Prepared For The Cozad Local

### Tells True Story of John J. Cozad



Dr. Robert H. Gatewood, a Las Vegas, Nevada, dentist, was prompted by the publication of "The Early History of Cozad," published by The Local, to tell the true story of John J. Cozad and his son, Robert Henri.

Dr. Gatewood was born in Cozad in 1885 and moved in 1900 to Arapahoe, Nebraska, and later to McCook, Nebraska. Dr. Gatewood is closely related to the Cozad family.



The story tells of the gambler and townsite promoter who founded Cozad, Nebraska, and of his family, particularly his younger son, [who] became a world-famous artist and teacher known as "Robert Henri." This tale is essentially Robert's story, the story of a sensitive talented boy growing up in the midst of frontier violence. But it is also the story of the ambitious promoter and of frontier people fighting hunger, cold, blizzards, droughts, grasshoppers, prairie fires, and ruthless cartmen.

The book's characters are all drawn from life and given their actual names; the events can be documented.

## MURAT Q. KEENEY FAMILY

Murat Quentin Keeney was the first person to help make the dream of a Hendricks County Historical Museum a reality with his contribution of \$1,000.

Murat Quentin Keeney was born in Middle Township in 1852. He was the son of John Willis and Mary Waters Keeney, both of whom were descendants of the first settlers of Hendricks County and who established their home in the same dwelling where they spent their entire married life with the exception of a few months. This home—a brick house erected at a cost of \$2,000—was located a few miles west of Pittsboro on what is now Highway 136. The house is still standing and used for residence.

Murat was an only child and grew up to be a studious, serious young man. He graduated from Pittsboro High School in 1878 with the second graduation class of that high school which had been organized in 1874. In his class were four boys and one girl, all of whom distinguished themselves in some way: Dr. Aubrey Peabworth, well-known physician in Indianapolis; Tom L. Dillon, associated with International Harvester Company for many years; a cum laude graduate of Indiana Law School; Fred Worrell, a promising young businessman

who died in young manhood, and Murat Keeney, who traveled to Illinois and engaged in teaching school. Mary Dugan was later the postmistress at Pittsboro.

In a few years, Murat returned to Indiana and purchased a farm five and one half miles northwest of Fall in Orange County. An interesting story appeared in a local paper concerning his move there: "A certain young man, born and reared in this township, bled himself to another county and bought a farm. The deal included the crop and possessions, so when the time came, the young man bade his father and mother goodbye and left for his new location. He was not a very loquacious young man, so the neighbors did not know if he was a married man. All the marriageable young women in the neighborhood talked about him and set their caps for him. One day their hopes vanished into thin air when the word flew through the neighborhood that a tall, stately lady had arrived at the young man's farm. After due discussion, the neighbors decided to charivari them and they

Early in the administration of President *Franklin D. Roosevelt*, the *Agricultural Adjustment Act* was passed. *Murat* was appointed to be a county administrator to assist farmers in recovering from the Depression. He continued this work for several years, then returned to farming.

Always interested in current affairs and politics, he was a candidate for *State Representative* in 1934.

In 1948, the *Keeneys* moved from their farm home into an attractive brick home, which they had built, on *Osborne Avenue*. *Dorothy* died in 1954, after several years of failing health. In October 1955, *Murat* remarried, this time to *Mrs. Madeline Hawkins*, the woman who had introduced

him to his first wife and who had been a lifelong friend. They continued to live in the *Keeney* home on *Osborne Avenue* in *Pixider* and enjoyed many activities and visits of many friends and relatives.

In 1965, *Murat* died and for a short time *Maud* continued to live in his home, then entered a retirement home in *Indianapolis*. "A Club for Independent Living" in *July 1972*, *Maud* observed his 90th birthday with an open house at the home of *Mrs. and Mrs. Debra* in *Evans*. Many friends came to congratulate him.

Physical frailties culminated in a terminal illness which ended his life here in 1972. It is regrettable that he was survived by no close relatives.
