MARVIN DUNCAN KEENEY was the fifth child of Thomas and Hannah Keeney. He was born 22 May 1802 in Pennsylvania, probably Luzerne County. The 1820 census lists the Thomas Keeney family living in the town of Berkshire, BroomeCounty, New York.

About 1829, Marvin married Sally Barker (born c.1810 in New York). They became the parents of:

William b. c1830, Keith b. c1832, Lucinda b. c1833, Louisa E b. c1835 Lucy b. c1838, Loyal V b c1841, Nelson Byron b. c1843, T. Corwin b. c1845, and Charlotte b. c1847

By the time their fourth child was born in 1835, Marvin and Sally had moved their family to Munson, Geauga County, Ohio, along

Sally died about 1858. Recruiters appealed for volunteers to serve in the Civil War. Four of the five boys and several cousins joined various regiments. Corwin, the youngest and last to volunteer, was captured at Trevillain Station, Virginia, then sent to Andersonville Prison. He died of dysentery in 1865, just weeks before the war ended.

In 1864, Marvin married a widow, Eliza Jane Nevins Canfield Waste. Once again, it was time to move on. With most of his sons scattered and daughters married, Marvin moved with Eliza c.1867 to a homstead near Sterling, Bay County (now Arenac), Michigan. His son Nelson B. and her daughter, Olive Lovina Waste (b. 1857) completed the household.

The family settled on 160 acres next to Marvin's brother, Harvey. Marvin's homestead papers claimed a 24x18' story-and-a-half log home of two rooms, with seven windows and four doors; plus a 30x24 log barn, all on three cleared acres.

By 1880. Marvin and Harvey's widowed brother, Esek, had moved to the area with his daughter and her husband, Abigail and Lloyd Rowley. Marvin died in 1885. By that time, Nelson was living in

nearby West Bay City with his wife and children.

The wilderness has a way of bringing people together. Nelson B., 31, and Olive, 16, tied the knot in August 1874. The warly years of their marriage are saddened by the death of their first two children. Three children survived to adulthood: Zilpha, Bessie

While living in West Bay City, Nelson worked at a series of jobs, ranging from operating a confectionery to carpentry work. In 1890, as his young daughter, Zilpha, watched from across the street, Nelson fell to his death from the second story of a neighbor's house. For a time after, Olive worked as a cook in a lumber camp while her mother (Marvin's widow, Eliza Jane) cared for

the children. Olive later married William Bricker of Negley, Ohio. Zilpha Keeney married William Hills c.1902 in Bay City. They moved to Detroit about 1920 with their children: Hubert, Bessie,

Clara and Ellen Suzanne.

Leo Keeney married Bessie May Burson and raised a family of nine in Sparta, Ohio. Their children were Margaret, Mildred, Marvin, Mary, Franklin, Harvey, Elta May and twins David and Dennis.

Bessie Keeney married Clarence Funkhauser. They lived in Cleveland, Ohio and Orlando, Florida. There were no children of this union.

Barnaby Keeney, 1955-1966

Barnaby Keeney received his doctorate in history from Harvard in 1939 and taught there until 1941, when after the attack on Pearl Harbor, he enlisted in the Army and served with the 35th Infantry as an officer in charge of an intelligence interpreters team. He was awarded the Bronze Star, the Purple Heart, and the Silver Star, and was discharged a captain.

After the war ended, he studied in Europe before coming to Brown in 1946 as assistant professor of history. He became Dean of the Graduate School in 1949, at the age of 34, and served in this position (with the exception of a leave of absence in 1951 to work for the Central Intelligence Agency) until 1953, when he became Dean of the College. Two years later he was elected president.

Keeney's presidency was another period of remarkable growth: over a dozen major facilities were either acquired by the University or built on its campus, undergraduate enrollment increased by nearly 1,000, the Graduate School nearly tripled in size, and \$82 million was raised. Keeney's resignation in 1966 spared the popular president from much of the turmoil that was spreading across college campuses and that was to weaken the presidency of his successor.

Stires Jade Keeney was born on May 26, 1869, in Lewiston, West Va., and passed away at Onaga, Kansas, May 3, 1953 at the age of 83 years, 11 mos. and 7 days.





KEENEY-LITTLEPAGE MARRIAGE IN 1814 PRODUCES NOTED FAMILY LINE INCLUDING JUDGE, STATE SENATOR AND CONGRESSMAN

Land Record Abstract: JOHN D. LITTLEPAGE - 1792 - Greenbrier Co VA

IN 1840 SAM LITTLEPAGE embarked on the career of a salt maker near Kanawha Salines, now Malden. In 1847 he bought the farm on Kanawha Two Mile where the handsome hand-dressed stone-house in which he reared his family was built. It is still one of Charleston's historic landmarks.

SHIRLEY DONNELLY

CATHARINE KEENEY of the Muddy Creek area of Greenbrier Co VA/WV was married on 27 December I814 in Giles Co VA to CHARLES LITTLEPAGE. By the time of the I830 census both familkies were listed in Kanawha County.

Catherine, yet a teenager, was the second child of MOSES & FRANCES HARRIS KEEN-EY and aranddaughter of JOHN KEENEY, the original Keeney settler on the Greenbrier River, based on a 1750 land grant. Witnesses at the 1814 wedding were her grandfather John Keeney and William Brawley, husband of her older sister Frances in Greenbrier in 1809.

By I830 the newlyweds and her parents were listed as residents of Kanawha County in the US Census. Father Moses was recorded with wife, two sons and one daughtrer, Charles Littlepage was isted at age 40-50 and the Keeneys in the 20-30 age range, with two daughters.

John Littlepage, listed in the 1787 Greenbrier tax list, was the sole family member listed in the 1810 census. He had signed a 1783 petition requesting a wagon road from Great Levels to Warm Springs. At the outbreak of the war between the states both father and son John joined the Confederate Army. The father was killed early in ther war and CHARLES, the next oldest son, took his place. Both were kisted as members of the Texas Rangers

ADAM LITTLEPAGE

Adam B Littlepage, son of Charles & Catherine Keeney Littlepage, was born in 1817. He was killed at Dublin VA during the Civil War. Hehad married Rebecca T Wood in 1845and they were parents of John W 1848, Fanny 1850, Charles 1852 (who lived at Fleetwood Hotel in Charleston with wife and 2 children), Congressman Alexander 1854, Judge Samuel 1858 and ADAM B LITTLEPAGE 1859.

Young Adam Littlepage went to Indiana in his youth but returned to Charleston in 1882 to open a law practice in 1882. He married Eva

: My great grandfather was John Keeney...he was the son of Jim Keeney and Amanda Hamby. that he had brothers named Jim Keeney, Jasper Keeney, Thomas Keeney and a sister named Martha Keeney.
My grandfather died at the age of 42 in Roane Co. Tennessee in 1916. He was killed in a wagon accident. He was married to Della Price Keeney. Thats all I know. Can anyone give me any more information on this branch of the Keeney Mfamily.

KEENEY KIN IN CUMBERLAND CO TENNESSEE

The Keeney family was one of the early families of Tennessee, receiving land on the North Carolina/Tennessee border as a result of service on the Virginia frontier following the French & Indian War. Brothers John, Joseph, James and William were among the early settlers in Greene, Cocke and Jefferson County, but Joseph became a pioneer settler of Anderson County and many of his desendents still reside in Andersin and neighboring ciunties. Other families such as Boatright, Moore < Dumas, Overton, Leach, Lindsay, Queener, Oldham and McGlothlen became connected with the family by marriage.

Joseph Keeney, son of John Keeney, who first received a land grant along the Greenbrier river in Virginia (now WV), parted from the others to settle in Anderson Co TN, along with brothers William (1795-1819) and James Michael (1795-1849). He was a settler at the time Anderson became a county.

The Joseph Keeney family spread out into from Campbell Co, Morgan County, and especially Cumberland County, from where not a few moved on into Arkansas.

JOHN KEENEY INQUIRY

THOMAS KEENEY is listed in the 1850 and 1860 census reports of Cumberland County TN at age 55 and 65. Records list him with wife Sarah Moore, whom he married in 1820.

JOHN KEENEY b. 1822 in cUmberland Co, was the father of THOMAS JOHN KEENEY, b.1846, listed at age 54 in the 1900 census and 62 in the 1910 census, married Martha S Hamby in 1873; she was listed as a widow with THOMAS B KEENEY, son, at age 66 in 1920.

Children of Thomas John & Martha Keeney, listed in various e-mail and various census reports, include Johnnie 1875, Charlotte 1879, Rachel 1882, Jasper L 1885, Thomas B 1899, Cordelia 1902, Margarette 1906, and Vernal Howard 1909.

The 1900 Cumberland Co census lists Thomas J Keeney 1846 Martha 1852, Lotta 1879, Rachel 1881, Jasper 1885 and Thomas 1897. Rachel was married to McCamey Nichols and was the mother of Audrey, Etta May, Winford, Sylvia Edith, Ada, Fred and Dee Stanley Nichols.

JOHN KEENEY b.1854 died in Roane Co TN when a farm wagon overturned in 1916. He was married to Della Price.

NEW YORK/MICHIGAN

Our great grandfather, Joseph Keeney, was a farmer until he married Mary Bishop. He then went into the mercantile business. In 1817 they moved to Leroy, N. Y. When Jonathan Bishop was two years old. At Leroy, Joseph bought a farm which he worked until his death in 1842. Mary Bishop, the wife of Joseph, was born in New Lynn, Conn., 1781, and. died at Leroy, N.Y., in 1877, aged 96. Jonathan lived at home until he was 20. He then went to Franklin, Lenawee County, Mich., where he bought up land on section 21 and 22; After he had been in Michigan four years he married to Amanda Mallery. They lived at Franklin until 1849, when he sold his farm to his brother, John Keeney. On this farm he had two sons and three daughters. They then bought. up 160 acres in Cambridge, Lenawee County, Mich., and lived there until the death of his dear wife, our mother and grandmother. This occurred Feb. 9, 1885, while she was at the home of her son, John William, who lived in South Riley, Clinton County. She was 62 years of age. On the farm at Cambridge were born seven sons and one daughter. This farm was called one of the best in the county. The house was of brick, standing above the road and enclosed by a stone wall. At this home many a Thanksgiving dinner was enjoyed, and at no time was anyone turned away. Different sons worked the farm but at last it was sold to Arthur White. Father Keeney made his home with his son, Alanson, in Adrian, Mich., where he died April 20, 1897, aged 82. Both he and his wife were buried in the Cambridge cemetery, near the church where our mother and grandmother was superintendent of the Sunday school for so many years up until the time of her death. Father Keeney was a whig and later became a republican. As for religion he was a Baptist as were his father and mother. Mother Keeney was an Episcopalian and probably would have been a republican could she have voted.
